I used this book while planning our recent trip (Dec.2012-Jan. 2013) to Sri Lanka and then referred to it regularly throughout the journey.During the planning phase of our trip, I used information from

the book to help narrow down the places on the island that would be most appropriate for us to visit for the time frame that we had, which was 3 weeks instead of 3 months. Not only are the descriptions quite entertaining (very humorous!), but each chapter has wonderful pictures to accompany the stories. There are also links to their website where you can view additional pictures.Once we were on the island, I constantly referred to the book in order to refresh my memory about the history or importance of wherever we happened to be that day. My husband also enjoyed being able to get a solid overview of a place, which you will get from this book, without having to spend an entire day doing it.While they do not offer a lot of recommendations for hotels or restaurants, the ones they do recommend are good. Another benefit of a book such as this one is that you get ideas for those "off the beaten path" places that you might not otherwise see, such as the Kandy Garrison Cemetery, which is well worth a visit.I look forward to buying another "For 91 Days in..." in the future, and I highly recommend this series.

This book is actually a compilation from these guys' blog; it wouldn't be good to read on a Kindle e-reader, but was a fun experience on my Kindle FIRE tablet. Most chapters contain links to their original website to view additional photos, sometimes links to their YouTube videos, which wouldn't work if reading this on just a Kindle.I'm traveling to Sri Lanka in 11 days, and enjoyed reading this e-book the most of all books I've read for this country. Their experiences were fun to read, and they traveled to all the areas my tour group will be visiting. I appreciated their insight on the culture, people, temples, and history of Sri Lanka.

I have been following these travelers on their blog site, facebook page, flickr, and now ebooks, which are a wonderful portable way to take their travels with me on my phone. Since they live in each location, this time Sri Lanka, and call it their home for three months, it's a little more intimate than the usual "where-to-go" and "what-to-do". It's more about the experience of Sri Lanka. The authors take in people, places, religion, learn Sinhalese, try new food and drink, meet a few monkeys, run away from leeches, hug an elephant. They approach their travels with good humor and some seriousness, so you get some laughs alongside a history lesson. The photos are amazing and tell a story on their own. They did a great job formatting their stories to ebook, and you can link to their blog posts, YouTube videos, and a few other things.

I was unaware of Michael Powell and Juergen Horn's blog before reading this book. I'm preparing a trip to Sri Lanka in February/March 2013 time frame and I found this book to be quite helpful in

determining areas to spend a majority of my time while traveling around Sri Lanka. Michael provides sufficient detail and colorful commentary on the various sights he and Juergen visited that you truly get a sense of what to expect if you decide to visit some of the same locations. Also, Juergen's photographs are great and the links to video captured during their visit and included in the blog is a really nice touch to the e-book. I definitely would recommend this book and I intend to use it throughout my upcoming travels to Sri Lanka.

I wanted to whet my appetite before my trip to Sri Lanka and this Kindle eBook certainly did the trick. It is wasted on a standard Kindle, however the pictures were fantastic when viewed on Kindle for PC. The backstories really add to the book. This is a great series of travelogues, check them all out!

We are planning a trip to Sri Lanka next June. Through their humorous and informative narrative and thanks to gorgeous photographs, Michael Powell and Juergen Horn gave me a feel for the country and an excellent preview of the discoveries awaiting us.
