

Okay book, wish the charts were a little simpler to navigate and not much in terms of pathophysiology or pharmacology, otherwise okay. I expected much more and will have to supplement with Hazzard's Geriatric Medicine and Gerontology. Authors, if you are reading this and you should, as a colleague to a colleague, the book needs to be greatly expanded to meet demands of clinical pharmacists. I would suggest stealing some points, like pharmacological class and pathophysiological approach review from Hazzard's. Sorry, but some of your charts group different drug classes and diseases together like LT modifiers in COPD chapter (zileuton and monteleukast - different MOAs) and COPD/Asthma - different pathophysiology > grouping makes things all the more unclear and confusing necessitating use of other sources, like Hazzard's, which is getting free advertisement.
