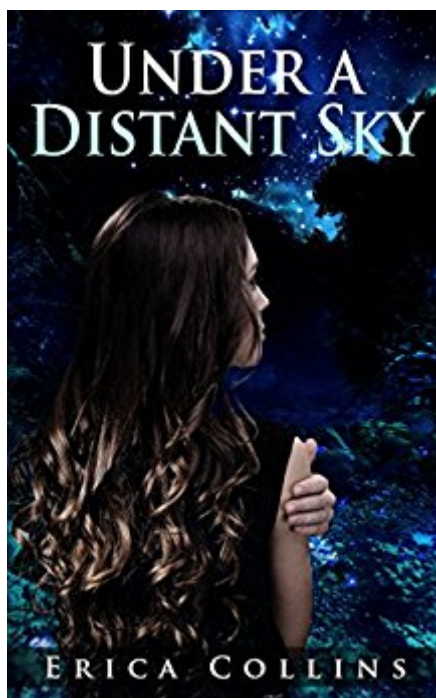


The book was found
