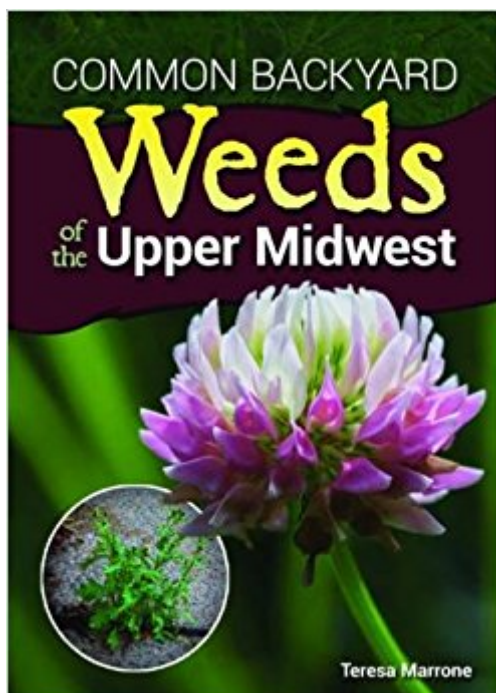

Very good concise "everyman's/everywoman's" guide to common wild plants ("weeds"). It is specifically written for the upper midwest but the plants identified in here are very similar to the NE US (I lived many years in Pennsylvania and most, if not all, of the plants in this book are as common in PA as they are in my current home-state of Illinois). I like how the book explains the best way to eradicate the plants and emphasizes natural removal over using chemicals - although it is applicable for anyone even for those who cannot be swayed from using chemical sprays. A big bonus is that the usefulness of each plant is listed ... you may find that some of your weeds aren't so evil and can be put in your salad.

We live in Missouri but this book has all our weeds in there.

Good photos for identifying weeds from more desirable plants and good advice on how to successfully and permanently remove those weeds.

I am finding this book to be very valuable. The photographs are very good for identification purposes. The book lists weeds that I cannot find in other books. It is careful to explain if the weed is noxious or invasive. I find it a valuable tool in addition to my other identification books.
