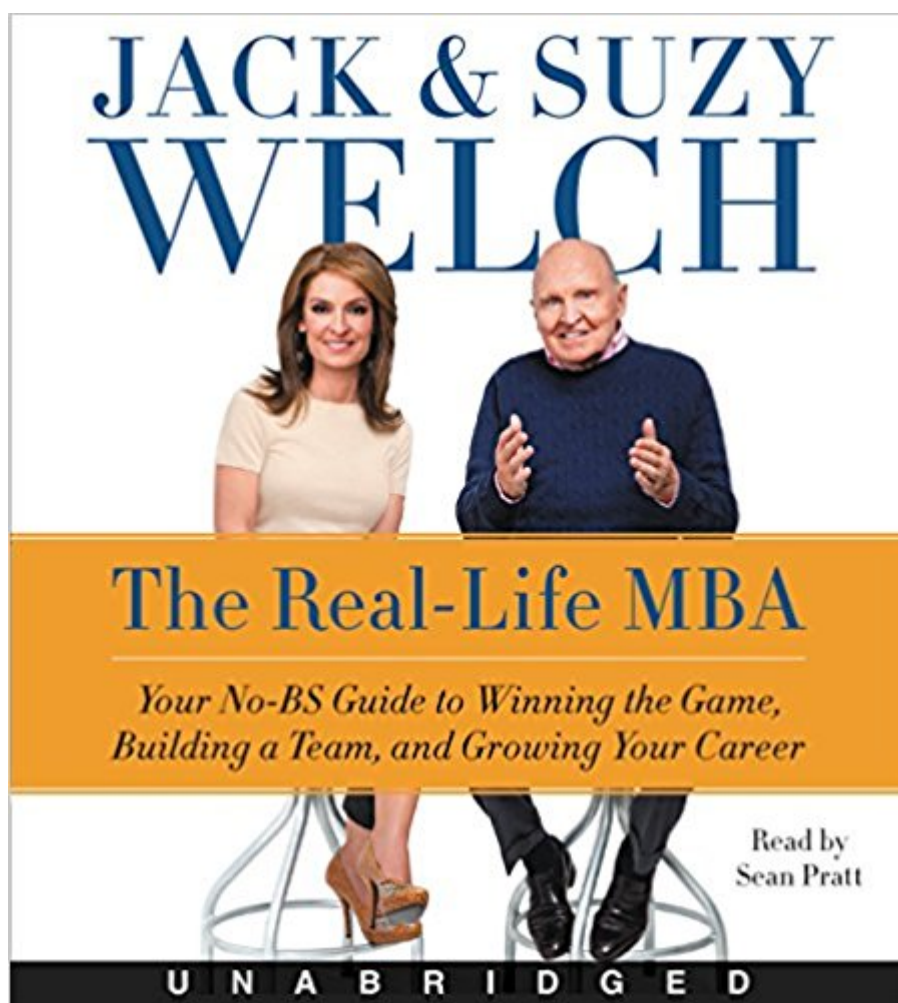


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# The Real-Life MBA CD: Your No-BS Guide To Winning The Game, Building A Team, And Growing Your Career

Full disclosure: I have an MBA already.So why a two star review? Because this book doesn’t really teach you anything. It’s not a crash course in MBA topics or skills. It’s pretty much echoing a mantra of "Be intelligent, be flexible", but it really lacks a target audience. It seems to be floating towards an audience of CEOs, senior managers, or up-and-coming managers, but it just isn’t really going to

help you do much. "Don't retain people who steal from you." Obvious. "If you specialize at one thing, use people who are better than you at the other things." Obvious. This could be a good book for people brand new to the business world, but those people are going to lack the position, influence, or authority to actually implement anything that's being taught here.

It's a small book by page count and by size, and the contents while interesting and VERY MOTIVATING are thin .... Nothing new. What I'll say is that the duo are motivating and reassuring for people in an awful marketplace, so I gave it to two older friends trying to find new job alternatives but fearing they have no real options. That said, it is one step longer than a HBR article, but less substantive, and generally plays aggregator for stuff already out there to make the point that people need to respect and leverage their experience - not feel embarrassed not to have all the letters behind their names.
