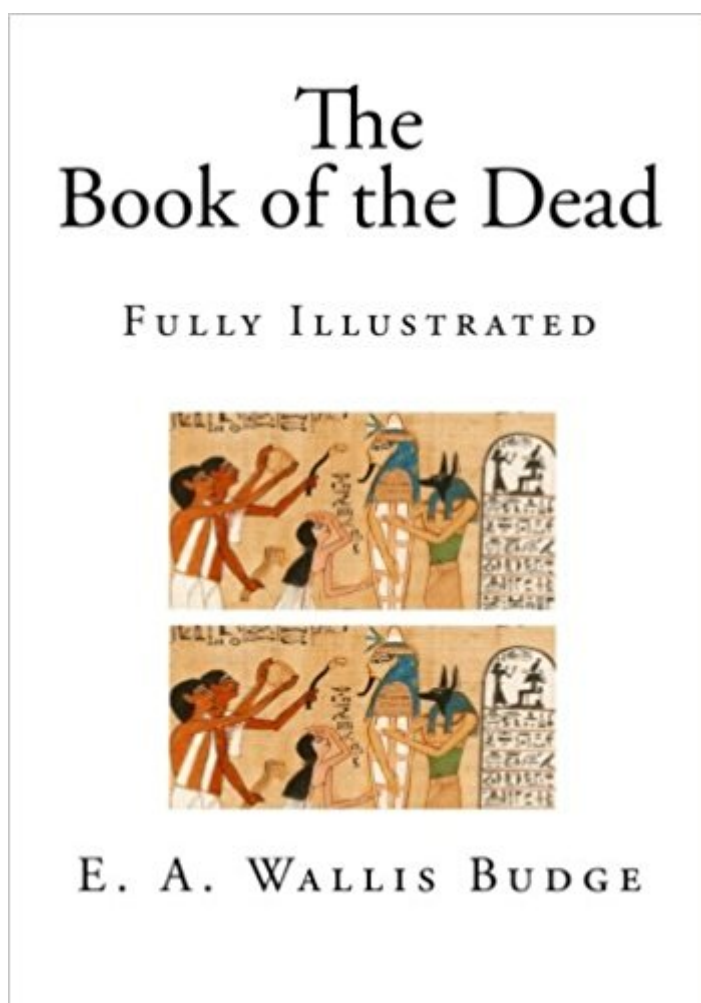

The Book Of The Dead: Fully Illustrated (The Egyptian Book Of The Dead)



Synopsis

The Book of the Dead by E. A. Wallis Budge. Because of the substantial amount of hieroglyphics interspersed in the original text, I have omitted the ### 'glyph' placeholder where context permits, for readability. Only actual illustrations have been inserted into the file. Due to space considerations the interlinear translation, which is primarily of interest to students of Ancient Egyptian, will not be posted. This should not be a hardship, since the Dover reprint edition is still in print and widely available. The file above, which appears at on the Internet at Sacred-Texts for the first time is a faithful e-text of the 1895 edition of the E.A. Wallace Budge translation of the Egyptian Book of the Dead. In November of 2000 I inventoried my library and found that I was missing Budge's Book of the Dead. So when a copy of the Dover reprint came up at the local used bookstore, I purchased it. To my dismay, the version of the text widely posted on the Internet did not seem to match the Dover reprint of the 1895 version. According to John Mark Ockerbloom, the proprietor of the excellent Online Books Page, the version circulating on the Internet is a highly edited version of Budge from a much later date (1913). He writes: "I did a little legwork, and it appears that the "mystery text" is in fact from the Medici Society edition of 1913. According to a 1960 reprint by University Books, for this edition "The translation was rewritten... [and the] greater part of the Introduction was also rewritten by Sir Wallis, who concluded a preface to it with the pleased words, 'and the entire work thus becomes truly a "New Edition"'. It's unclear whether Budge himself did the rewrite of the translation, but it's clear that he at least claims responsibility for it, and it does appear to draw fairly heavily on his earlier translation." Thanks to Mr. Ockerbloom for clearing up this mystery.

The book of the dead, or as the ancient Egyptians would have it, the book of coming forth by day, is a masterpiece of erudition as translated by the eminent efforts of E.A. Wallis Budge. His translation is simply the benchmark by which all others are to be judged. It has well stood the test of time, as well indeed has the book itself.

A reasonably well presented facsimile of the of the 1920 Edition.The half plate reproductions are just acceptable with a large lens.The original text is dated and of course highly questionable.It is a book that will join a number of other Budge originals and copies in my library.Reproduction books are often irritating in that they are often incomplete - My copies of Budge; The Papyrus of Ani; A reproduction in facsimile, is missing all of the 37 essential plates, Budge The Egyptian book of the Dead; The Papyrus of Ani Egyptian Text Transliteration and Translation missing once again the original 37 Plates, & Budge; Papyrus of Ani, The Egyptian Book of the Dead, is printed in some 'New Age' type which seems intent on placing the contents firmly within a context of crystals & incense! None of these books sadly contain the printing history of the publications, and this last one, once again has no title on the spine!
