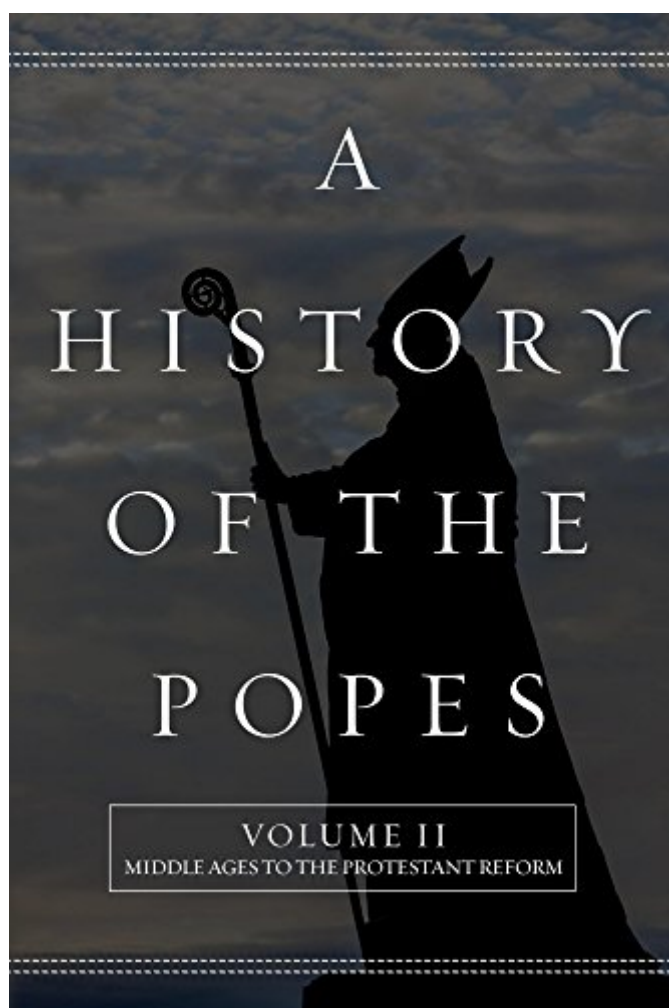

The thumbnail sketches of the Popes are so interesting, but this series takes it a step further...the Popes are looked at as men of their times, and there is just enough background of the various historical events to keep the reader entranced. I have but one complaint. As a direct descendent of Pope Alexander VI, I have always known that he is generally considered the worst pope in history. I don't see how he is much different than many others. Also, his stopping a war between Spain and Portugal over the lands of the New World, by drawing the line, was not mentioned. I think that is a mitigating factor in considering how good or bad he was. So, that little tidbit, causes me some question about other individuals.
