

INTRODUCTIONInto Each Life a Little Rain Must Fall,but in Some Lives, There are Tsunamisà Â Every life is a book.Ã Â Some are brief and sweet.Ã Â Others may be lengthy and extremely bitter. Over the years, I witnessed a vast number of profound miracles involving my family and myself. Though I never had a desire to author a book,Ã Â the Holy Spirit impressed me to do so immediately after my husband, Kenneth underwent brain surgeryà Â in September of 2003. Many details of that miraculous adventure have been shared here from my journal and other evidence.Ã Â You've heard the old adage: Into each life, a little rain must fall. Well, I've felt a need to add to it:à Inà Â some lives, there are tsunamis. As Garfield might say, "I resemble that remark." My firstborn daughter, KaShanta, calls me Job'ette. Therefore, I am in great anticipation of the

daysĂ Â ofĂ Â JobĂ Â moreĂ Â thanĂ Â hisĂ Â beginning."Ă Â I watched Ken die as I held his handĂ Â at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. As the breath left his body, I was unable to hold up his 6'4" frame,Ă Â so he slid down into a chair and onto the floor - code 10. Over the next two months, I really grew to dread hearing that terminology. That night, I walked the hall in my nightclothes andĂ Â battled with the spirit of deathĂ Â - reminding Satan of the authority that I possessed with Jesus as my Savior.Ă Â My declaration:Ă Â Ken would live and not die.Ă Â A defibrillator was utilized; and approximately twenty minutes after what seemed like an eternity,Ă Â the doctors were able to detect a faint pulse - in his wrist.Ă Â As they wheeled him off to the Intensive Care Unit, I could see him fighting. His eyes were fluttering so I yelled out to him that I was not going to leave him and everything would be allĂ Â right.Ă Â Doctors placed him on a ventilator to circulate air in and out of his lungs. Eventually, I was permitted to see him and just stood there in total devastation. Looking!Ă Â Thinking! This can't be happening to us.Ă Â Please God, let me wake up from this nightmare.Ă Â Ă Â However, I was not asleep.Ă Â Therefore, I could not wake up. Just wishing! But, this was real. ICU was freezing. A Â His stark naked, emaciated body was lying there - stiff as a board to the touch and purple in color. A Â His eyes were slightly cracked with a death gaze. Dr. Miat stressed, "When they are this far gone they never come back." Â Â Therefore, he advised me to have Ken disconnected from the ventilator. A Â Several family members traveled from Mississippi and joined me in a conference with this specialist. My brother, James Jr. had tears streaming down his face as he stood and proclaimed, "Ken is upstairs fighting for his life. We cannot give up on him." My oldest brother, Lawrence brought my father, James in a wheel chair. My mother - Lottie, my husband's sister - Katie, our daughter - Kamilia, her baby and all family members who could make the trip, came to support us. I drew so much strength from their presence. In fact, all of us had tear-stained faces. Then I remembered what the Lord told Ken to tell me when he was bleeding profusely after brain surgery in Meridian, Mississippi - just a week prior. His statement echoed in my ears, "We are in the eye of the storm and it is going to get rough; however, when tornadic activity interrupts our lives, A A the safest place to be is in the eye of the storm, because that' where the SON is." I don't remember ever hearing that until then. Since that day,I've learned some very interesting facts about the eye of a storm:1.Because the eye is so calm, the sun comes out, the wind virtually stops, and there A A is virtually no A A precipitation. 2. Oftentimes blue sky or stars can beà Â seen.3. The eye has the lowest surface pressure and temperatures tend to be atitsà Â warmest.Ã Â Psalms 107:29Ã Â He maketh the storm a calm, so that the waves thereof are still. A A In the midst of the most severe storms of our lives, we continue to find the SON, many blue skies and shining stars.
