

Since 1973, Rick Steves has spent about four months a year exploring Europe. His mission: to empower Americans to have European trips that are fun, affordable, and culturally broadening. Rick produces a best-selling guidebook series, a public television series, and a public radio show, and organizes small-group tours that take over 20,000 travelers to Europe annually. He does all of this with the help of a hardworking, well-traveled staff of 100 at Rick Steves' Europe in Edmonds, Washington, near Seattle. When not on the road, Rick is active in his church and with advocacy

groups focused on economic justice, drug policy reform, and ending hunger. The usual Rick Steves' thoroughness in providing information like whether to buy or not buy rail passes, for example. A bit to my surprise, a town like Chester in England is not included in the Table of Contents. For those of us of geriatric persuasion, a town like Chester might be visited on our tour by train or bus. Car travel is now out of the question for us, particularly on the "wrong" side of the road. All in all, this book lives up to the reputation of 'always thinking of the traveller' which we have found in other Rick Steves guides.

Like to have the basics and highly regard his recommendations. When his suggested places to stay are full I look to places within the area he chooses and have been pleased because they are safe and user friendly.

I love that there are recommendations on B&Bs and other places to stay, which I didn't see in other books. He gives directions for drivers as well as those who want to use trains and buses with holiday information and notation of days where service is reduced or perhaps non-existent. Fantastic book!

I am disappointed it did not cover Cornwall and Devon. It was not clear when I ordered that those areas were not included in the book. I WOULD NOT order it again.

I just returned from London, York and Edinburgh and found this book to be extremely helpful. The maps, train and tube information and sight information were perfect and allowed my son and I to easily navigate our way around each city and make the most of each day.

It completely enhanced our trip from places to see, sleep, and eat. A remarkable companion to planning a holiday there. It wouldn't have been as enjoyable and all encompassing without it.
