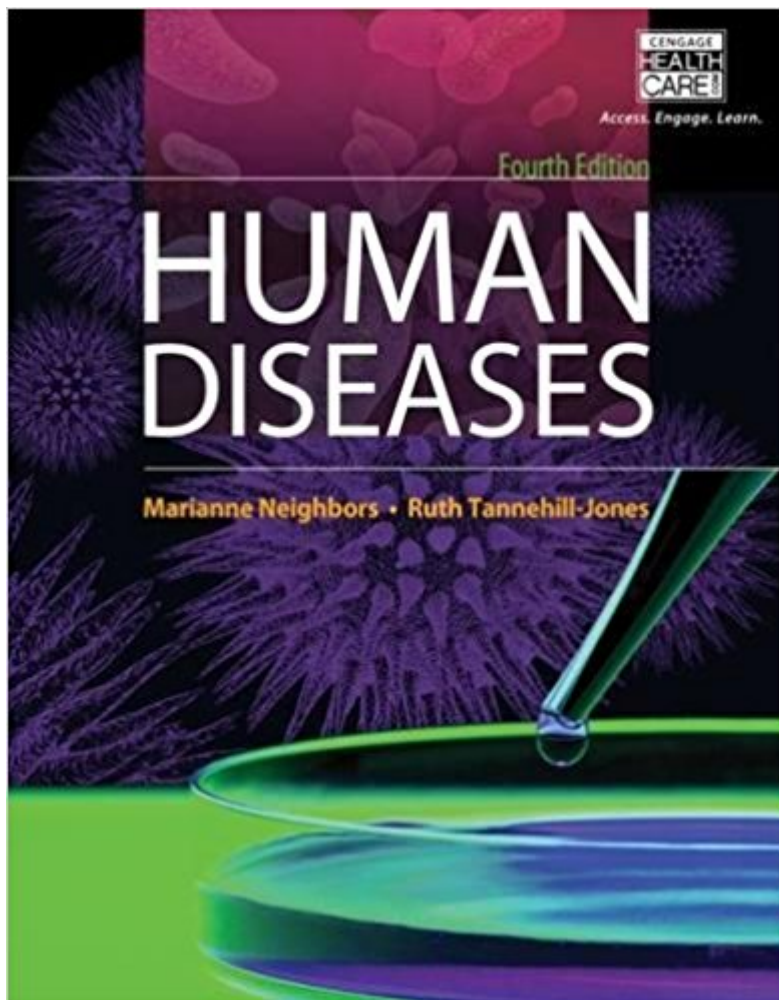

Poorly written, poorly conceived, riddled with errors of fact and grammar, filled with claptrap (herbal remedies, holistic medicine) in order to draw out the length of the text, this text needn't exist. However, it does exist, and is used to educate the poorly paid medical assistant who is most likely the one who takes your vitals at the doctor's office. The book is generally structured by outlining the functions of a body system, and then giving a list of diseases that affect said system, their symptoms and treatments. Being organized in this manner makes study exceedingly difficult. The treatments of problems effecting one system are usually the same or very similar, thus the information becomes a fog ailments and treatments. This gives one very little true understanding of disease. To be fair, medicine itself still has a very poor understanding of most disease, but one could still do better than this pedestrian pamphlet that has been freakishly bloated into a textbook.
