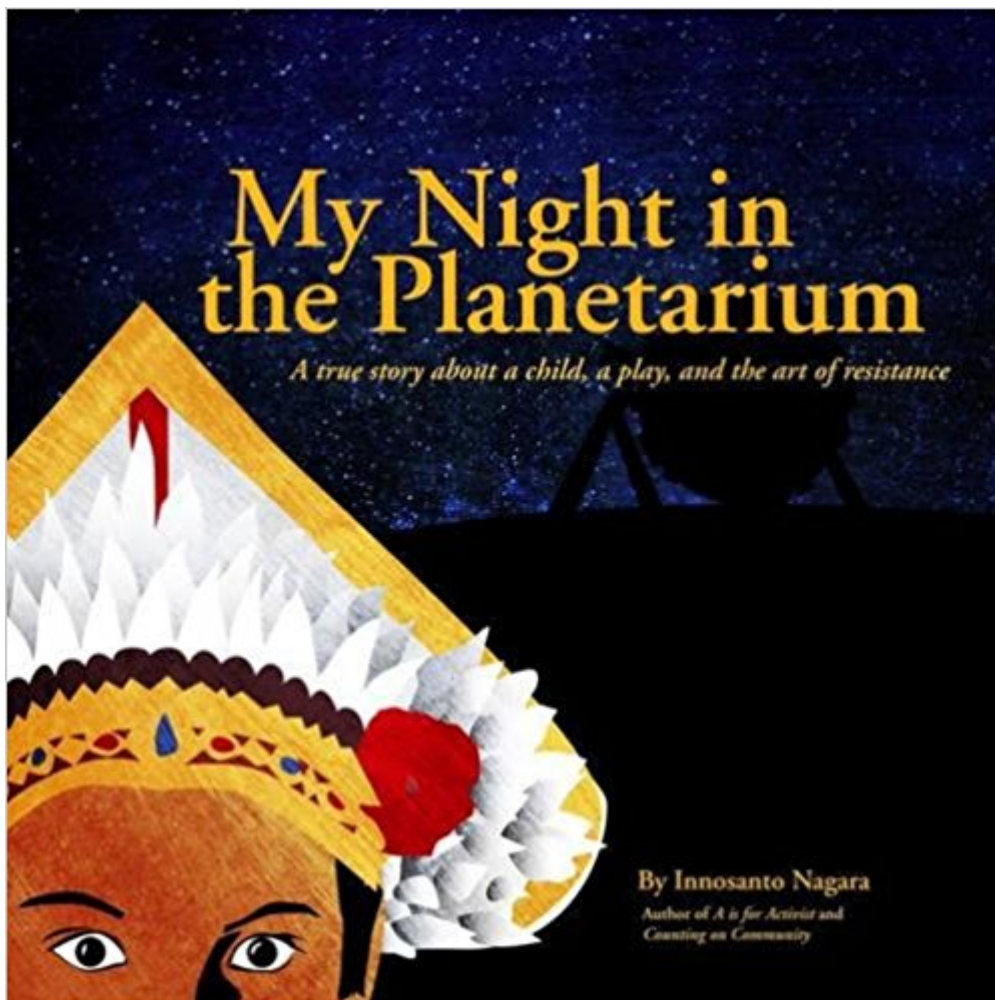

Synopsis

From the author/illustrator of the bestseller *A is for Activist* comes *My Night in the Planetarium*, a high-adventure, true story from his childhood in Indonesia. The thrill of spending the night in a museum is the capstone to a story ultimately about free speech, political progress, and artistic defiance. Featuring Inno's gorgeous art style recognizable from *A is for Activist*, *Counting on Community*, and his joyous activism, *My Night in the Planetarium* cleverly and humorously combines history, geography, politics, and activism in an adventure story of childhood wonder, political resistance, and familial connection. Seven year-old Inno's father, a famous Indonesian playwright, is in trouble with the government for his newest play's unfavorable portrayal of governmental power and corruption. After a rousing performance at a large theater complex which also houses the Jakarta Planetarium, Inno's father manages to sneak out of town to avoid arrest while Inno and his mother spend an exciting night sleeping under the stars in the Jakarta Planetarium. A beautiful introduction to the history and culture of Indonesia, *My Night at the Planetarium* is an engaging, thought-provoking starting point for a discussion of colonialism, political corruption, and artistic resistance.

Gr 2-5 • Nagara recounts what happened the night he and his mother stayed in a planetarium after a performance by his father's acting troupe. Nagara's father was an actor, playwright, and activist who often used his art as a means of peaceful protest against the oppressive government of Indonesia. Anticipating a clash with authorities after a final performance, his father escaped with the departing audience while Nagara and his mother hid out for the night in the planetarium, under the stars, so to speak. Nagara does provide some brief historical background of Indonesia: its colonization by the Dutch, its eventual independence, and the rise of a military-run government. The narrative is intimate and occasionally casual, which softens the impact of some of the scarier moments of the story but still engages readers and manages to explain colonization to young listeners. The pacing feels uneven at times, but overall this is a solid read. Collage and mixed-media illustrations are full of vibrant colors and lush detail. A brief epilogue gives further information about Nagara's father and his work. Freeman Awards Winner 2016 Children's Literature My Night in the Planetarium by Innosanto Nagara (Seven Stories Press) The Indonesian-born graphic designer, Innosanto Nagara, shares "a true story about a child, a play, and the act of resistance" in his award-winning autobiographical picture book. Starting with a lightly humorous overview of Indonesian history, through colonization by the Dutch, he leads up to 1977, a pivotal moment in his life, during the brutal rule of President Suharto.

Nagara's stunning illustrations depict a play performed in traditional Indonesian dance costumes created and performed by his father in which an unspecified army general is criticized. Police are sent to arrest his father and Innosanto and his mother flee from the production and hide in an adjacent planetarium. What could be a terrifying experience for a child becomes a night filled with the security of strong parental love and the magic of the stars.

Nagara's newest work, along with his earlier books, show the heroic potential of ordinary people and the power of art to challenge injustice.

I love all of Innosanto Nagara's kids' books, as does my daughter, who has grown up with them.... But THIS one is a different animal altogether: *My Night in the Planetarium* is a master work by a master storyteller. The illustrations are pitch-perfect and stunningly colored, as always with Nagara's books, but the true gem here is the story itself: a profound and poetic tale of a young boy forced into hiding with his family under the Indonesian dictatorship, told in a tone of retrospective wonder.
