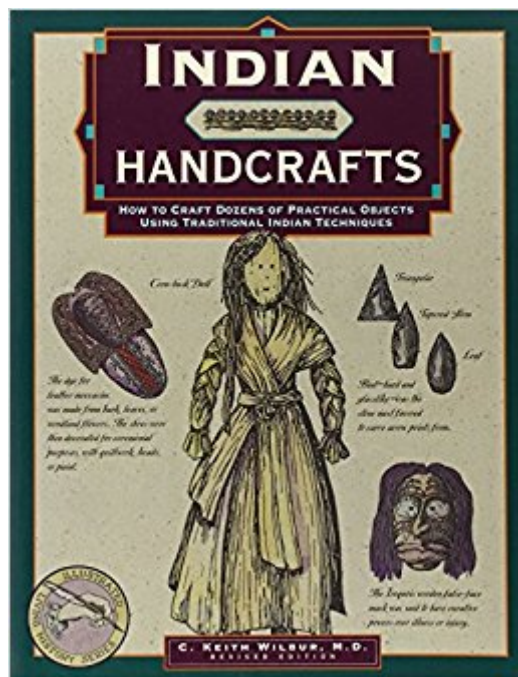

This is a great book. Heavily illustrated. It shows how American Indians made arrows, axes, baskets, and just about everything else. The diagrams are detailed enough to look like the items could be reproduced, but I have not tried any yet. A simple doll made from Cattails would be easy to do. More complex projects like arrows or baskets would need some practice. Historic fact are also included. If you are interested in how the first Americans lived, or primitive survival methods this book is for you.

I loved this book. I think some of the illustrations make it look like it was designed for a young

audience. Although many teenaged readers could use it, the caliber of language and intricacy of instruction is at an adult level.
