Chin, has been with us since the first book. Helen's the exact same age as Lara Jean, so she has aged right along with the books--16 for *To All the Boys I've Loved Before*, 17 for *P.S. I Still Love You*, and 18 for *Always and Forever, Lara Jean*. I brought in a lot of my own things for this shoot. The pink hairbrush, the framed picture of Leonardo DiCaprio, the little teacups, the perfume bottles. I wanted the space to feel as personal and as real as possible. Jenny Han surprised her fans with the most heartfelt novel in the series! *Always and Forever, Lara Jean* sparkles with its pop culture references, Lara Jean's pursuit for the perfect chocolate chip recipe, Peter's charm and of course the sisterly bonding between the Song sisters. The novel dives in around Easter time during Lara Jean's senior year of high school. Everyone is waiting to hear back from college and Lara Jean is super nervous to see where she gets accepted to. Readers are reunited with returning characters and are introduced to some new faces. *Always and Forever, Lara Jean* is a roller coaster full of emotions with a forthcoming wedding, a death of a loved one and senior year with its ongoing anticipation of going off to college. *Always and Forever, Lara Jean* shows realistic display of anticipation for the college waiting game. The excitement and the upset are both on point and the ups and the downs of relationships are true. But in the end, everything is worth it. Although people may have certain thoughts about Lara Jean's and Peter's relationship, it is ultimately Lara Jean's and Peter's decision that matters. Through best of times and the worst of times, they stayed strong. Both write their own story as they mature from book 1 to book 3. Although, I always rooted for a Lara Jean and John Ambrose McClaren shipping, Miss Han's ending of the novel brings the series full circle because, after all, it all started with a love letter. The message in Lara Jean's yearbook

from Peter is perfection! I don't want to spoil it but you MUST pick up this book if you've read the first two books in the series. For those who haven't read *To All the Boys I've Loved Before*, add it to your TBR list. In fact, marathon *To All the Boys I've Loved Before*, *P.S. I Still Love You* and *Always and Forever, Lara Jean*!

It felt so right to leave Lara Jean and her story with this book. I loved all the pop culture references and the sweet moments between her growing family and Peter. Despite the plan of this series being only two books, this addition does not seem forced. The story flows just as well as the first two and I finished this book completely satisfied with the ending! I was not disappointed whatsoever.

I am a huge fan of Lara Jean's story and have been since I read the first book picking it just by the cover randomly. I was over the moon that there would be another installment to the story. This is my least favorite book of the 3. I felt it ended horribly and considering the author claims this is the final book for Lara Jean, it almost ruins the story for me. The ending did not seem final as in I will never know anything more. I feel I could've done without this book because the ending was nonclimatic but overall the whole book was non-eventful. Definitely could've been way better especially if it's the last the readers will hear about Lara Jean.

I've become attached to the Song girls and the budding relationship of Lara Jean and Peter. You laugh with them, cry with them, and celebrate all of the happy moments they share. I know there's more to Lara Jean and Peter, though I'll have to imagine it on my own. Thank you Jenny Han for these stories that feel like they're more than a series, they feel like friends. Can't wait to read your book!

When I found out Jenny Han was continuing Lara Jean's story, and making the *To All the Boys I've Loved Before* duology, a trilogy, I was so excited! From the moment I put down *P.S. I Still Love You* (#2 in the series), I was very eager for more of Lara Jean's story, and wasn't too disappointed in this third and final installment. This surprise follow-up to Lara Jean's story follows her through her busy senior year. She's preparing for college, head over heels in love with her boyfriend Peter, her dad is getting married, and her sister Margot is coming home for the summer. She has made a plan, and is ready for the next chapter. But when her plans get a major wrench thrown in them, she has to decide what to do, and where to go next. I really enjoyed this last book.

We got plenty of Kitty, Margot, and lovable Lara Jean. I just wish there had been more of Peter and Lara Jean together. I mean, there were scenes with them obviously, but I *felt* selfish and wanted more. Their relationship has really grown since the last book. They are having more meaningful conversations about deeper and more personal topics. I wanted more of that. I wanted to see more of Peter and Lara Jean discussing their hardships with each other. But I will say, that their lack of being 100% honest with each other does come into play in the book. No spoilers here so I *feel* just going to leave it there. What I like about Peter and Lara Jean is the fact that they seem like real teenagers. They aren't overly mature for their age, but they aren't immature either. They make poor choices without thinking, but then they are really thoughtful in their decisions in other ways. I felt Han portrayed typical 17/18-year-olds very well. Lara Jean still seems a little, not immature, but maybe childish, in the way she sometimes acts/thinks in the book. I *feel* not sure if it is Lara Jean the character, or just how Jenny Han writes *this* is the only series of hers I've read. All in all, I *feel* really happy I read this series, and this final installment. I was very satisfied with the ending, and where Lara Jean's path was headed to next!

I mean what can I say about this amazing conclusion! I was hesitant to read it because I liked the way book 2 ended but I'm so glad I did because this was a great continuation to Lara Jean's story. It was cute and sweet. There are decisions she has to make that I think a lot of us have had to make or will have to make. Highly recommended!
