

Bruce Durie has written a number of regional history books, including Glasgow Past & Present and Kirkclady & East Fife.

I will be honest, I have spent a fair amount on Genealogy books. Some books are less than what I expected and others have been what I had hoped to see. I consider almost all my books as decent or better references. This book however has raised the standard against which all others will be judged. To say I am impressed is an understatement.

My only problem is one possibly common to many of us genealogists--the font is too small. I have got very used to my Kindle where I can make it the easiest size for me. Other than that, I find the book is very informative.

This book is good for those beginning the search for their ancestors. I was a bit further along and I already knew most of the techniques shown, so it wasn't as valuable a resource as I had hoped.
