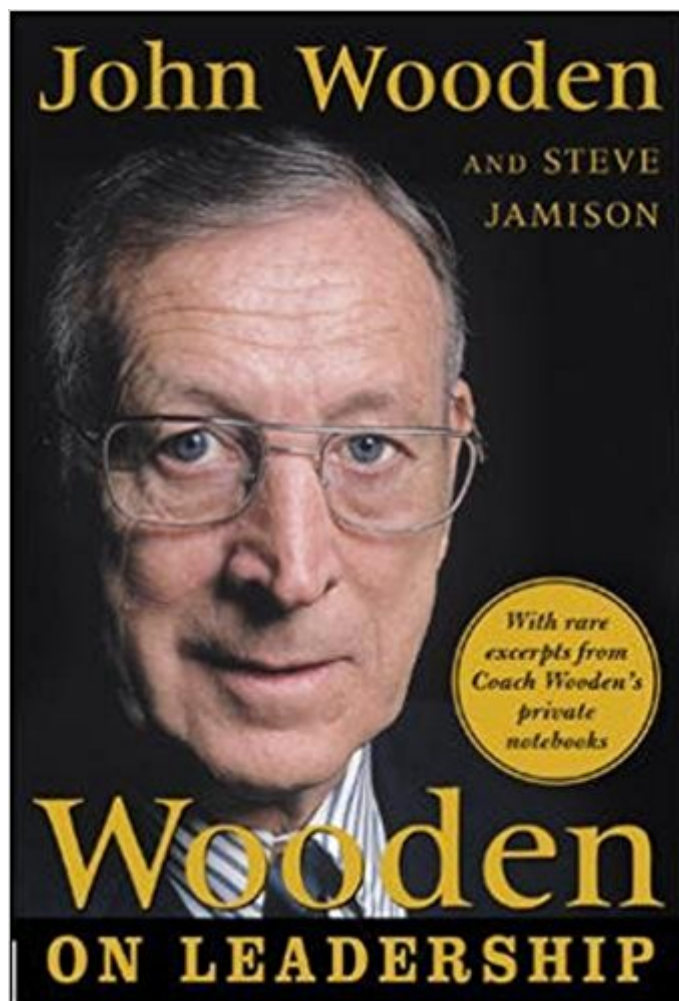

Coach Wooden was indisputably a genius at coaching and teaching basketball. But he was also a genius at an overall approach to life and leadership. His Pyramid of Success is not a hastily devised piece of paper with a few good suggestions. It is a carefully thought out guide that reflects many years of experience and consideration. For example, Coach Wooden's description of his revision of the definition of "Team Spirit" is very instructive and insightful. He realized that it was not enough for his players to be "willing" to sacrifice for the good of the team; he wanted them to be "eager" to make such sacrifices. This and many other observations in this book are profound. The book provides a very useful and detailed guide that can help any leader (or person) make significant improvements.

Wooden is masterful at winning, in a way that keeps your focus on the process of becoming a winner while not obsessing over winning. He truly redefines winning. This is good for every leader, and should be mandatory for every sports coach today. It could cure the current out of control sports culture that exists. We need more that think like this. "Winning is maximizing your personal potential, if enough people on the team do that the score will take care of itself." - Wooden

One of my top favorite leadership books yet! I don't know much about basketball or am a coach of sports and still found this book very valuable. Wooden has a perspective and style on leadership that isn't seen much in this society. It teaches you to focus more on the details and hard work that go into a win instead of focusing on winning itself. This gives everyone on the team (including the leader) something that's in their control to do their best. It's a transformational perspective more leaders should follow suit in.

This is an extraordinary book on leadership. The typical ones might advocate not sweating on the small stuff, Wooden would emphasize the importance of paying meticulous attention to pertinent details and handle them with balance; while others mentions the power of sincere praises, Wooden expands it further by adding the importance of flexibility and so on. The chapters on the importance

of managing time, and dealing with fate are some uncommon but useful topics not covered very well by other books on leadership that I have read.

I am NOT a sports person and had never heard of Coach Wooden until I read this. Even though it was written a while ago, it is surprisingly entertaining, interesting, and applicable to modern day. Excellent.
