This one was off so slow to get into. Seem to take forever until it finally got to the present day and I began to be quite exciting. I ordinarily like Jennifer Youngblood she's one of my favorite and I was a little disappointed that it didn't make me want to turn the pages right away. But I still read her books I love them clean .

Okay...I'm hopping mad. The writer is talented and knows how to pull the reader in and weave a story. However, ending a very long book with 1) a cliffhanger 2) the story unfinished just doesn't work for me. A reader wants to finish a book...not be forced to buy a second book to find out what happened to the person bitten by a rattler, or others in a tangled story. (Snarl) I wrote Jennifer Youngblood's name on a card in my file, so I will never buy another of her books to find out the ending of the last one. Nope!

The characters are well-written and developed BUT I do not like having a book end on a cliff-hanger and relationships unresolved. If I hadn't been given this book and the next free, I would not have read them because of that fact.

I usually judge how great a book is by how hard it is to put down once you start reading it. I thought this book was very very good because, even though it wasn't a shorter length book, I still read it all

in one sitting. Before I knew it I was so wrapped up in this masterfully told story that I soon found myself on the edge of the seat, echoing one of the characters in the book when he would ask "What happened next?" The story follows a mother and daughter from two different generations. The mother is trying to deal with feelings caused by the threat of her past resurfacing and the memories that she kept hidden from her family for years. Finding a good place to heal and put down new roots, the daughter tries to forge a new life for herself and her family while she recovers from life's unexpected twists. It's a clean book with a little bit of everything tossed in. I definitely recommend reading it to add a bit of mystery, intrigue, and of course romance into your afternoon. I loved reading the therapist sessions. It does end with a cliffhanger.

Forgive ME: Second Chance Book 1 is by Jennifer Youngblood and Sandra Poole. This is a really good series; but must be read in order. The second book will not make sense if you read it first. It is about second chances. Sybil is reaching the end of her rope with everything she has to do for the Christmas season. She is on so many different committees and so many of the other members are not pulling their weight. It is a matter of honor that she does everything to perfection. Besides her committees, she has her husband to look after and support and their daughter to keep on track. She also has to do all of this to the high expectations and standards of her mother, Delia Reynolds. Delia has everything she had ever wished for- money, prestige, social status, a husband who loves her, and her daughter. Well, almost. Sybil is still in need of molding and handholding. She still hasn't fit the mold. Then Sybil is forced to face the fact that her husband is leaving her for his partner and now Sybil is the divorcee and single mother of a rebellious daughter. Delia won't let her grieve long and tries to get her back in the mold. Sybil rebels and leaves Atlanta, taking her daughter, to a small town three hours from Atlanta. What she doesn't know is that she has returned to her Mother's hometown! Delia hasn't told anyone about her background!

Oh, my! I love so many things about this book -- the southern flair, the family secrets, the suspense, but most of all the heart of it. These authors are some of my favorites and I would highly recommend anything they write.
